

Hermann Park Conservancy

McWilliams Dog Park launched Feb. 22, McWilliams Dog Park is a \$2 million off-leash dog park; it's step one of the 20-year renovation master plan for Hermann Park. McWilliams Dog Park will have one of the largest interactive dog park water features in the city; separate areas for small and large breeds; canine agility courses; surface-level parking; and natural shade and placement on an elevated site, meant to be free from flooding. Completion is anticipated by the end of 2022.
